Reading Rocks!

This week we continued with our new unit, **Reading Stragegies**. This week we practiced rereading by



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studying the picture to determine what is happening in the story. Once the student establishes the general idea of the story, he/she can then check the words to see if their ideas were correct. The more thinking a student does about a book, the better his/her comprehension will be.

Growing Writers

This week we began our new writing unit, **Opinion Letters**. We have been reading books that contain letters, to learn about the format and style of letter writing. This week the students also began to talk about their opinions and strong feelings in the books they are reading. These will be used to write opinion letters in the weeks to come.

Math Matters!

This week in math, the students continued to collect data for their class survey. The students also wrote subtraction math stories for a class book. We began our class collection of **BOTTLE CAPS!** Thank you for sending them in...we will be collecting them for about a month.

Science Spin

This week for science, we began our final unit for the year, **Is It Living?** This week we read the classic Eric Carle book, **The Tiny Seed** to learn about the different ways that seeds can travel. We also studied and sorted many kinds of seeds, and we planted some new ones. We are hoping for more sprouts than we had last time!



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The Leader in Me

Randolph Elementary is a Leader in Me school. This week we began to review **Habit 1: Be Proactive (I'm In Charge of Me)**. We read the classic story, **The Carrot Seed**. In this story, a little boy never gives up on the seed he planted.

Everyone around him tells him that it will never grow but he makes up his mind and sticks to it! He decides that **it's up to him**, because he is the only one who is committed to making sure his seed is well cared for. He demonstrates many of our good character qualities as well, such as **grit** and **responsibility**. Ask your kindergartener what happened at the end of the story. It was a BIG surprise!

Character Counts!

This week we began to review all of the good character traits we have learned this year.

We continued our review this week by looking once again at **responsibility**. We read a book called **Farmer Duck**. In this story, there is a very lazy farmer, who makes the duck do all the work on the farm. Eventually, the other animals get fed up with the lazy farmer and run him off of the farm. Duck, along with the other animals, take over all of the jobs on the farm, and because they are very **responsible** (unlike the farmer), they end up living happily ever after.

Friendly Reminders

Things your kindergartner will need each day, for a successful day of school:

- ** A water bottle and a healthy snack.** Please remember to save candy, cookies, and chips for lunch.
- ** Their blue folder.** Please empty this each night. It will often contain homework or notes to be filled out and returned.
